## ASDA SEDATION REENDORSEMENT PROGRAM

### DAY 1: Thursday 10 November 2016

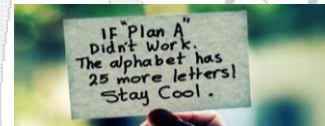
